

WHEREAS, we have been apprised that from June 23-27. 1999, the St. Louis Concordia Turners Gymnastic Society and the City of St. Louis will once again host the 50th National Festival of the American Turners; and

WHEREAS, the National Festival, which is held every four years, is a family oriented event highlighting athletic competition and good sportsmanship as well as the ideals and high standards of the Turner organization; and

WHEREAS, the Turner tradition was begun in this country by German immigrants including Friedrich Ludwig Jahn, who helped establish physical education classes in the public school systems; and

WHEREAS, the St. Louis Concordia Turners Gymnastic Society was founded in 1875 and has welcomed the Festival to St. Louis on five different occasions, most recently in 1975; and

WHEREAS, this year's National Festival of the American Turners will attract more than 600 competitors from 60 cities around the country and will include athletes from Germany;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis that welcome all of the competitors and their families to the City of St. Louis for the 50th National Festival of the American Turners and we thank them for their many contributions to this community and to communities throughout the country and we further direct the Clerk of this Board to spread a copy of this Resolution across the minutes of these proceedings and to prepare a commemorative copy to the end that it may be presented to our honoree at a time and place deemed appropriate by the Sponsor.

Whereas, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives readily acknowledge the benefits that sports education creates for individuals who seek to develop and maintain healthy bodies and sound minds as preparation for the challenges of both today and tomorrow; and

Whereas, the history of physical education in the United States is very much the history of the American Turners which is the end result of a sporting tradition brought to this country by German immigrants and Friedrich Ludwig Jahn who helped to establish physical education classes in public schools; and

Whereas, while Turner programs have evolved down through the years in keeping with the changes in our society, the National Festival or Turnfest has remained a highly esteemed and constant event; and

Whereas, held every four years, Turnfest competitions involve individuals and teams from all over the United States in gymnastics, track, swimming, volleyball, golf, drills, and cultural achievements; and

Whereas, with sixty cities participating in this National Festival, the Turner organization welcomes competitors from its home country of Germany and uses the exhibition and competitive activities to demonstrate the ideals and standards of work in American Turner societies from across the United States; and

Whereas, family oriented with emphasis on competition and good sportsmanship, events involve competitors who range in age from young children to senior citizens with more than fifty years of experience in Turner challenges; and

Whereas, founded in 1875, the St. Louis Concordia Turners Gymnastic Society will host the next National Festival of the American Turners from June 23-27, 1999, in what will be the fiftieth festival since 1851 and the sixth to be held in St. Louis:

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, Ninetieth General Assembly, join unanimously to applaud the work of the American Turners Society and to welcome its events back to the Show-Me State with an illustrious host to be found in the City of St. Louis; and
